

Overview of language levels

According to CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference)



A1 Beginner

• Listening:

I can understand familiar words and simple sentences when spoken slowly and clearly.

• Reading:

I can understand familiar names, words and simple phrases on signs, posters etc.

• Speaking:

I can communicate using simple sentences. I can introduce myself and other people and answer simple, personal questions, e.g. about where I live.

• Writing:

I can write a short postcard. I can fill in name, address and nationality on forms.



A2 Basic skills

• Listening:

I can understand simple information on topics such as family, shopping and work. I understand the main information of simple messages and announcements.

• Reading:

I can find specific information in simple texts (timetables, menus). I can understand simple letters.

• Speaking:

I can communicate in simple, routine situations. I can describe my personal and professional environment.

• Writing:

I can write short notes and messages. I can write a simple personal letter.



B1 Advanced language use

Listening:

I can understand the main information in texts about work, school and leisure. I can understand slowly, clearly-spoken reports.

• Reading:

I can understand texts in everyday and professional language. I can understand private letters telling of events, feelings and wishes.

• Speaking:

I can participate in conversations about family, hobbies, work, travel and current events.

• Writing:

I can write simple texts on familiar topics. I can describe my experiences and impressions in personal letters.





B2 Independent use of language

• Listening:

I can follow longer speeches and presentations. I can understand clearly spoken news, reports and films.

• Reading:

I can read articles and reports and understand the author's points of view. I can understand modern literary prose texts.

• Speaking:

I can communicate with native speakers in conversations and participate actively in discussions.

• Writing:

I can reproduce detailed information on various topics and present arguments in reports and letters.



C1 Proficient language skills

Listening:

I can follow longer speeches. I can understand reports and films without much difficulty.

Reading:

I can understand long, complex texts of different styles. I can understand technical articles and longer technical instructions.

• Speaking:

I can express myself spontaneously, fluently, and precisely. I can present complex issues in detail and conclude speeches appropriately.

• Writing:

I can write about complex issues in letters, reports and essays in an appropriate style.



C2 Approximate native speaker proficiency

• Listening:

I can understand technical lectures and presentations containing many colloquial and regional expressions or foreign terminology.

• Reading:

I can understand abstract texts with complex content and language, e.g., manuals, technical articles, literary works.

• Speaking:

I can give a lecture on a complex topic and also express subtle nuances of meaning.

• Writing:

I can summarize information from different sources and reproduce the arguments in such a way that a coherent presentation emerges.
